Mission

The mission of Aurora Area Interfaith Food Pantry is to help end local hunger by ensuring that everyone has access to enough nourishing food, thereby helping our overall community stay healthy and productive.

1 in 8 Children in Illinois is Food Insecure

For too many families in our community, food insecurity is not a new concept, but a pervasive problem that has plagued them over the course of their lives. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, 7 percent of Kane County residents were food insecure, meaning they lacked consistent access to enough nutritious food to have an active, healthy life. Due to the impact of the pandemic, including illness, unemployment, lost wages, closed schools, shelter-in-place directives, and increased food and gas prices, 1 in 10 Kane County residents is now food insecure. The pandemic has highlighted the stark reality that many families in the Fox Valley area live paycheck to paycheck and cannot afford unforeseen expenses.

Over the past 21 months, Aurora Area Interfaith Food Pantry has stepped up in response, pivoting its operations and innovating its partnerships to help our community



navigate the new normal while ensuring the safety and health of its neighbors, volunteers and staff. We have invested deeply in finding new ways to achieve our mission with far fewer volunteers and reinventing fundraising activities on which we have traditionally relied, to serve the 400 percent increase in need we experienced at the pantry during the pandemic.

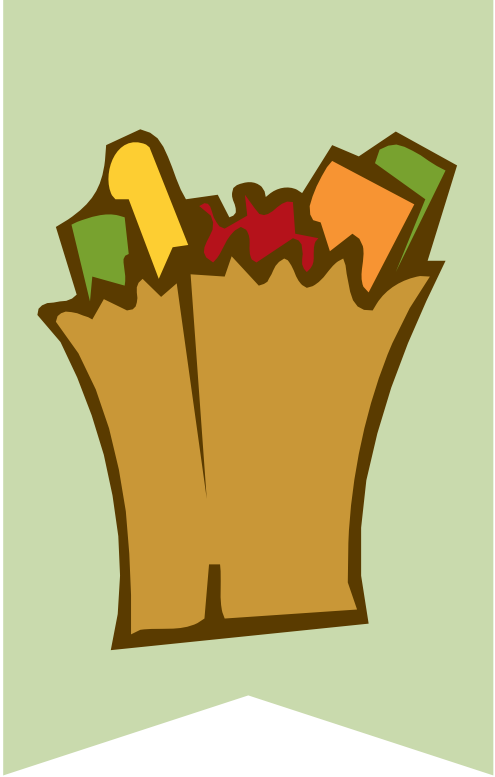
We continue to break down food-access barriers by creating programming that brings food to the people who need it most. Our Pantry To-Go program delivers emergency food boxes once a week to those who lack transportation, have mobility issues, or are housebound. Additionally, our other mobile pantries serve families with children, low-income seniors and women.

Enacting a drive-thru system, our regular weekly distributions at the pantry have kept our neighbors, volunteers, and staff safe during a pandemic while still meeting our mission. In February of 2022, we hope to welcome our neighbors back inside for our new client-choice marketplace where people can browse the aisles to make choices based on their taste, dietary and cultural needs.

While the pandemic has been a tremendous challenge, it has allowed tremendous opportunities for growth. It has renewed our deep commitment to combating food insecurity and the issues of cyclical poverty. This year we celebrated our 40 years of service to the Fox Valley region. We are so grateful to our founders, a group of concerned community members that saw the profound need in 1981 and answered the call to feed their neighbors. We are inspired by their actions, and we think they would be proud of the progress we have made over the past four decades. Just like in the beginning of our formation, it takes community members like you who care deeply for the dignity, health and vitality of their neighbors that allow our organization to thrive.



Without your support, we could not have met the intense needs of our community. Because of you, we were able to serve 100 percent of those who came to the pantry in 2021, In addition to the increased number of neighbors served, 2021 also presented the challenge of a need for a new roof, the



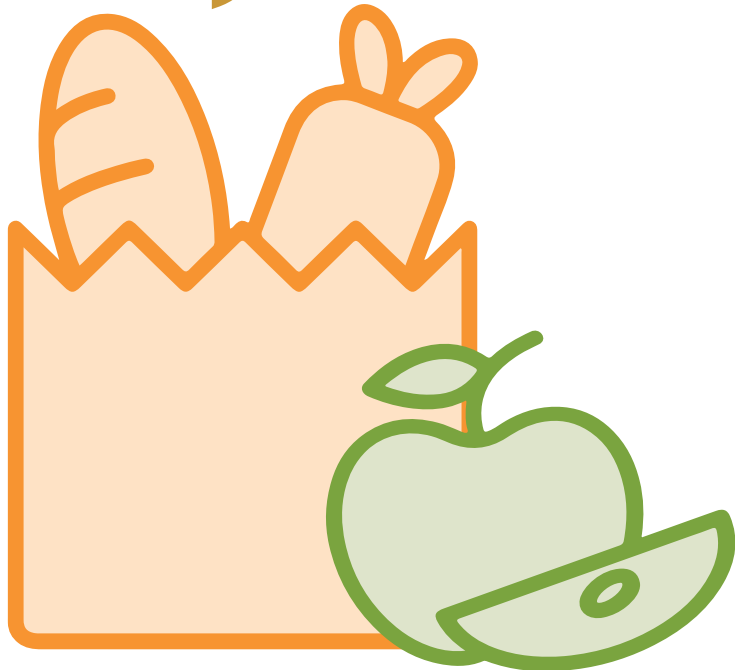

Last year over 200,000 hours were logged by over 700 volunteers. Each distribution day requires 25+ volunteers to ensure operations run smoothly. We cannot thank our volunteers enough for their time, service and dedication.

A typical day during distribution for a volunteer involves being assigned a station at one of our aisles: produce, refrigeration, frozen, bakery, warehouse and loading. Volunteers will keep their station stocked and check for expiration dates on the product being placed for our neighbors.

Beach has been an Aurora area community member most of her life and started volunteering at AAIFP in June, 2020. "After retiring, I wanted to do something meaningful," said Beach. "Volunteering has made me a better person. You don't always have to be paid to do what you know is right."

The AAIFP has become a second family for Beach and has given her a new purpose. A typical day at the food pantry involves a lot of hustle and bustle, she stated. Beach manages the produce section where she helps bag and distribute the items to our neighbors.

"We all have a focus on what we do, and we all do it well," said Beach. "Everyone has a heart for this [volunteering at the food pantry]. Some people just have to be here once and then they keep coming back!"

Beach arrives early on distribution days to get her team set up for the day and when she is here, she is always a ray of sunshine. "Tonya is thoughtful, considerate and an all-around awesome person," said Eddie Galvan, AAIFP Program Director. "She is a very hard worker who has dedicated many hours to the pantry and those we serve."

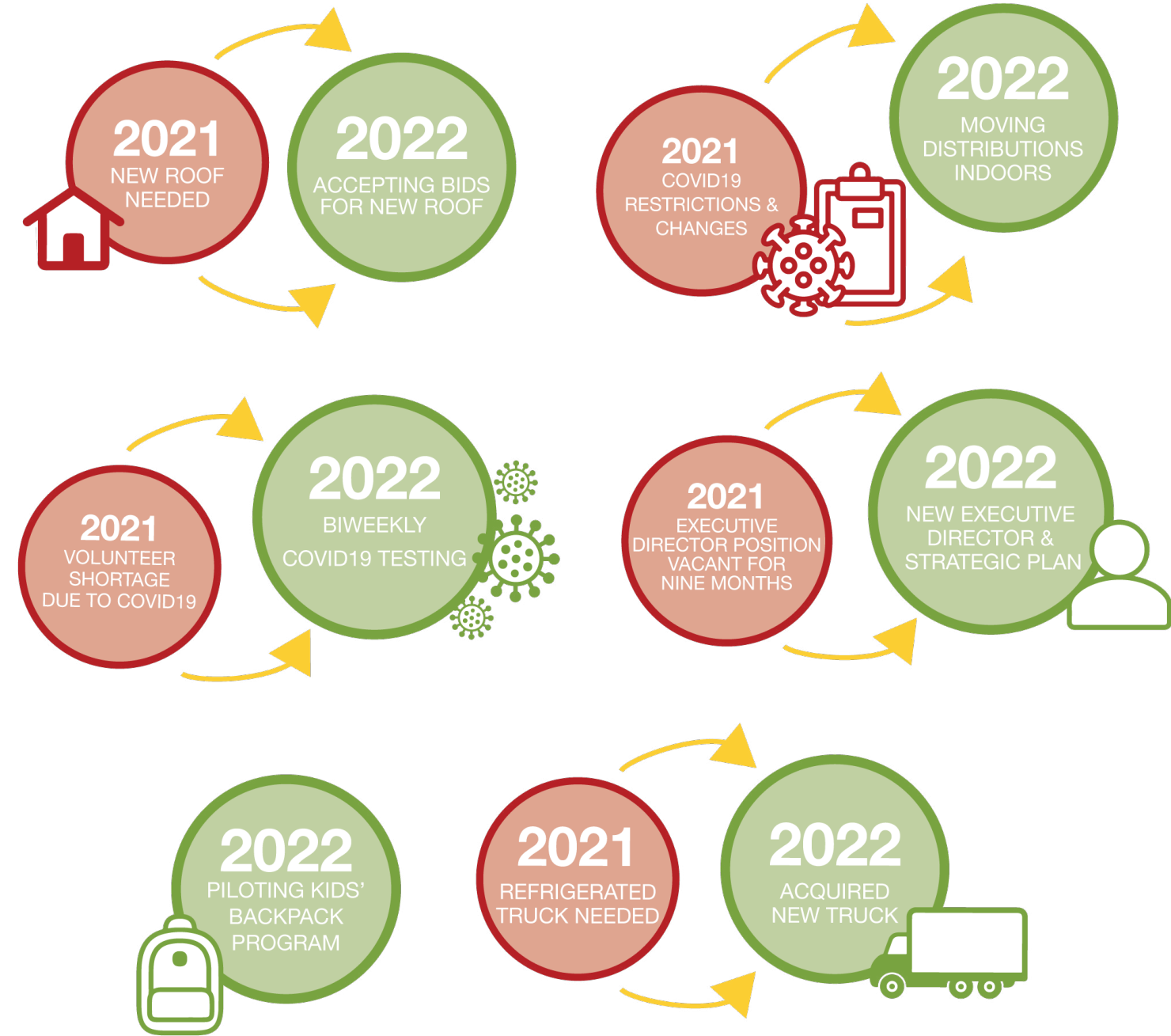
